"The best way to learn is by doing", and "All growth depends upon activity"


A structured, engaging Noun Activity was planned for the kids of Grade I. It included hands-on learning, visual support and literacy integration to help young learners understand what nouns are. Students learnt that nouns are words that name people, places, animals, or things, and with ease were able to identify nouns in pictures and simple sentences. Students were provided with a set of flashcards or slips of paper with different words written on them. They then sorted these words into four labelled containers or columns, then correctly identified and categorised nouns, improving their vocabulary and observation skills. This hands-on activity reinforced their understanding of nouns and their different categories playfully by making learning engaging, interactive, and memorable.



ZERO THE HERO!

Zero is a special number that might look small, but it's very important!

Learning by doing is a pedagogical method based on the idea that children can learn better and faster. To enable students to assimilate concepts through actions, the teachers of grade I engaged the students in an interactive Math Activity "Zero the Hero". Learning the zero concept is important in mathematics as zero is used as a placeholder in place values. The story of Zero the Hero was narrated to the students by teachers using colourful charts, and then students were encouraged to pair zero with different numbers to understand its place value. This activity enabled the students to acknowledge that, though Zero means "Nothing", it plays an important role when paired with other numbers on their right side. **Zero might be small, but it's a big help in math! Let's appreciate Zero and have fun learning about numbers. Zero is awesome!**



Roll, Rock & Jump – Multiplication Fun
