



## I Spy Something... Can You Guess It?

*"Puppets open the door to a child's imagination."*



This joyful, hands-on learning experience encouraged children to express their feelings freely, boosted their confidence, and nurtured their imaginative thinking.





## WORLD FOOD DAY SHARING BITES, SPREADING SMILES!

*Diwali is the festival of lights, love, and joy – brightening hearts and spreading happiness everywhere!*



