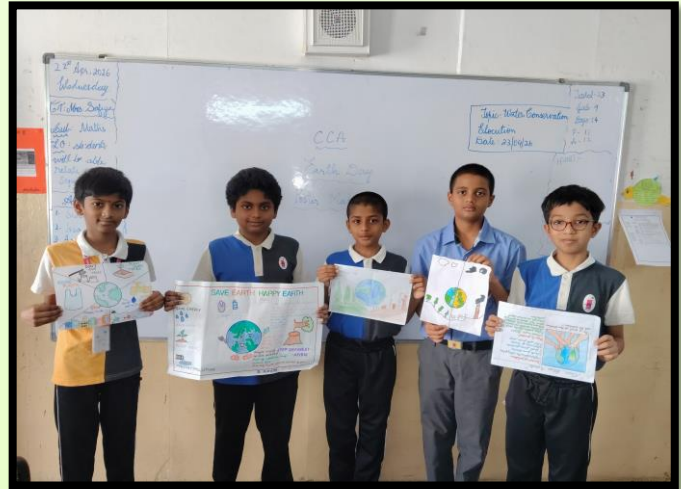


## WORLD EARTH DAY
