Protect Our Earth and Keep It Clean and Green

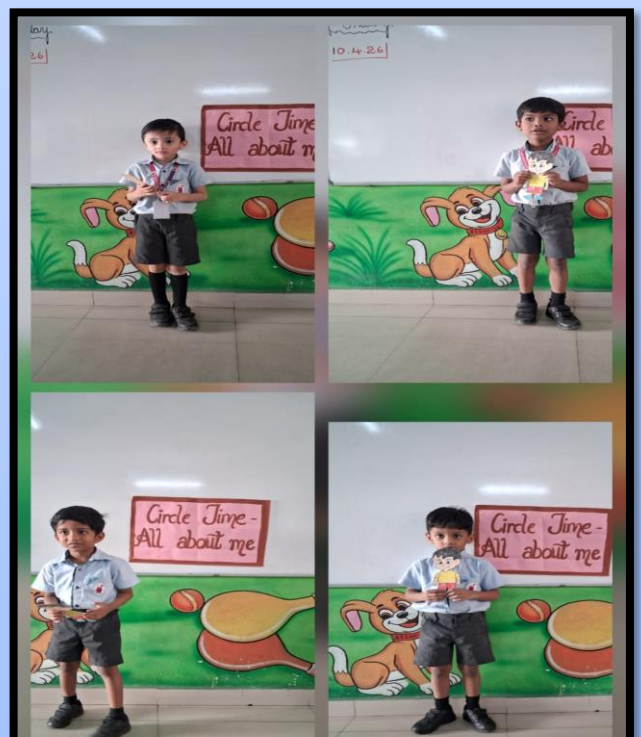
